


# FAMILY PLANNING & REPRODUCTIVE HEALTH IN KENYA

### Data Show Uneven Progress in Demand for Contraception Satisfied.

The demand for family planning satisfied with modern methods is a Sustainable Development Goal indicator. Data show that while demand for contraception satisfied has increased overall, married women ages 15 to 19 consistently have the least demand satisfied.

### Percent of Demand Satisfied, by Age Group and Year



### Most Women Are Using or Intend to Use Contraception.

Most women use or intend to use a method of contraception, except women ages 45 to 49. Women ages 15 to 19 and 20 to 24 are mostly non-users of contraception, but nearly all non-users in these age groups intend to use contraception in the future.


### Percent of Women Using or Intending to Use Contraception, by Age

### Government Institutions Are a Common Source of Contraception.

At least half of women in all age groups obtained their most recent form of contraception from a public institution, such as a government hospital, health center, or dispensary. The second most common source of contraception was a private source, such as private hospitals/clinics or a pharmacy/chemist. One in five women ages 15 to 19 obtained her most recent source of contraception from another private source such as shops, mobile clinics, or community-based health workers/distributors. This was more than double the percent of women in other age

County, the highest in Kenya. By comparison, Wajir

and Mandera Counties have roughly 2% contraceptive

The teen pregnancy rate in Muranga County, the lowest rate in Kenya. By comparison, Narok County has a 40% teen pregnancy rate.

The share of non-users of family planning that report hearing family planning messages on the radio in the last few months.

The share of non-users of family planning that heard political, religious, or community leaders speak favorably about family planning.

The percent of women ages 15-49 who have experienced sexual violence.

# **NOTES AND DEFINITIONS**

The data and figures are compiled from the 2014 Kenya Demographic and Health Survey (DHS) and from StatCompiler (2014 Kenya DHS). The 2014 Kenya DHS also references data from 2009 Kenya Population and Housing Census. Where PRB analysis is listed as a source, data analysis of the 2014 Kenya DHS survey data was done by Kristin Bietsch, research

associate, PRB. Data in call-out boxes are from 2014 Kenya Demographic Health Survey and PRB analysis of data.

Data in the table and figures may not sum to 100 percent due to rounded numbers and/or omitted data.

## **DEFINITIONS**

# Birth Intervals

Birth intervals refer to the length of time between births. Studies have shown that children born fewer than 24 months after a previous sibling are at greater risk of having poor health and that such births threaten maternal health.

Demand satisfied refers to the percent of women currently married or in a union who want to avoid or space pregnancy for two years and are using a modern method of family planning.

### Lifetime Births per Woman (Total Fertility Rate)

The total fertility rate (TFR) refers the average number of children a woman would have assuming that current age-specific fertility rates remain constant throughout her childbearing years (usually considered to be ages 15 to 49).

### Modern Methods of Contraception

Modern methods include female sterilization, male sterilization, pill, IUCD, injectable, implants, male condom, female condom, and lactational amenorrhea method (LAM).

### **Skilled Provider**

A skilled provider is a doctor or a nurse/midwife

The 2014 Kenya DHS lists the following as public institutions: government hospital, government health centre, government dispensary, or other public institutions; as private sources: private hospital/clinic, pharmacy/chemist, nursing/maternity, home, faith-based church/mission hospital/clinic, family health options/FHOK, or other private institutions; and as other private sources: mobile clinic, shop, community based distributor, community health worker, friend/relatives, and other

### Unmet Need for Family Planning

Women are considered to have an unmet need for family planning if they wish to delay, space, or limit their next pregnancy by two years or more and are not currently using any method of contraception.
